INFORMATION Update Reduction of PCR Exit Test Obligation

The Ministry of Health issued a new obligation regarding a PCR *test exit* for COVID-19 patients. The exit test is a PCR test carried out on the fifth day to find out whether the COVID-19 patient is still exposed to the virus or not. Previously, in the Decree of the Minister of Health No. HK.01.07/Menkes/4641/2021 concerning Guidelines for Implementation of Examination, Tracking, Quarantine, and Isolation in the Context of Accelerating Prevention and Control of CoronaVirus Disease (COVID-19), the PCR exit test must be performed twice; on the fifth day with a negative result, then it should be continued for the second PCR test that is the next day.

Following complaints regarding the color status of COVID-19 in the PeduliLindungi application, **the Ministry of Health reduced the exit test obligation start on 22nd February 2022** to simplify the process. Quoting from the official website of the Ministry of Health, the following is a summary of the new adjustments:

- 1. Exit test starting on 22nd February 2022 are only carried out once on the 5 (fifth) day of quarantine. After that, the PeduliLindungi application's status color will automatically change to green.
- 2. If the PCR exit test is not conducted, it is required to continue quarantine for 10 (ten) days for the color status to change into green automatically in the PeduliLindungi application.
- 3. If the symptoms persist after 10 (ten) days, continuing quarantine for 3 (three) more days is recommended.
- 4. There are four types of color in the PeduliLindungi application, which indicate the user's status: green, yellow, red, and black. Green means safe from COVID-19, yellow means only vaccinated with the first dose, red means unvaccinated, while black means COVID-19 positive, has a close contact history, or has just arrived abroad.
