Updates of the Extension of Enforcement of Restrictions on Community Activities (PPKM) Java-Bali to 1st August 2022

On July 5th 2022, the Covid-19 Handling Task Force announced the latest update of the COVID cases in Indonesia. It is reported that there were the additional 2,577 confirmed cases. The total confirmed cases reached 6,097,928 and recovered cases increased by 1,691 to bring the total to 5,923,808. The increasing number of covid cases were triggered by the new covid variant; BA4 and BA5. The BA4 and BA5 subvariants were assessed to have decreased ability to treat several types of monoclonal antibodies.

In order to contained spreading of the virus, the government continue to carry the expansion of the Community Activity Restrictions (PPKM) for Java-Bali. Following the President statement, the Ministry of Home Affairs has issued an Instruction to the Minister of Home Affairs (Inmendagri) No. 33 Year 2022 to implement the Level 3, Level 2, and Level 1 Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) PPKM in Java and Bali from 5th July to 1st August 2022.

The government has reintroduced the Java-Bali activity restrictions, with a few locations are implementing PPKM levels 1 and 2. The number of regions adopting PPKM Level 2 is 8, while the number of locations has achieved PPKM Level 1 is 114. Furthermore, the operating time of public places and facilities are allowed until 10:00 PM local time. Various changes have been made to the PPKM rules in Java-Bali, namely:

- 1. The implementation of activities in the non-essential sector is applied to:
 - Level 2: a maximum of 75% Work From Office (WFO) for vaccinated and employees
 - Level 1: a maximum of 100% WFO for vaccinated employees
- 2. Non-quarantine hospitality has a maximum capacity of 75% of visitors
- 3. Shopping activities are limited to operating hours until 10:00 PM local time with a maximum visitor capacity of 75%
- 4. Activities in places of worship are limited to a maximum of 75% capacity by implementing health protocols
- 5. Public facilities, public transportation, online taxis, rental vehicles, and aircraft are allowed with a maximum capacity of 75%

With this update, the Director General of Regional Development at the Ministry of Home Affairs, Safrizal, explained that this PPKM update needs a serious attention to all parties, especially in Java and Bali regions with Level 2 status and there might be a possibility to implement a full Work From Home (WFH) situation based on the daily covid case statistics.
