Summary of Indonesia's Exports and Imports in Quarter II 2022 (April-June 2022)

We would like to inform you of the summary of Indonesia's exports and imports for the second quarter of 2022 (April-June) according to the data from Statistics Indonesia (Badan Pusat Statistik/BPS) as follows:

Export

April: An increase in Indonesia's export value by 3.11% and reached USD 27.32 billion compared to March 2022. Non-oil and gas exports reached USD 25.89 billion or increased by 3.17% compared to the previous month. The largest commodity is mineral fuels. The European Union (EU) as an export destination country contributed to the value of non-oil and gas exports of USD 2.02 billion, respectively, while Italy contributed 1.19%. By industry classification the exports of manufacturing products increased by 29.19%, and by the province of origin West Java was the largest export producer, followed by East Kalimantan and East Java.

May: A decrease of value export by 21.29% or USD 21.51 billion compared to the previous month. Non-oil and gas exports reached USD 20.01 billion or a decrease of 22.71% compared to the previous month. The highest increase was nickel and articles thereof commodities.

The EU contributed USD 1.46 billion, respectively, while Italy contributed 1.14%. By industry classification the exports of manufacturing products increased by 25.00% and by the province of origin West Java was the largest export producer, followed by East Kalimantan and East Java.

June: An increase of value export by 21.30% or USD 26.09 billion compared to the previous month. Non-oil and gas exports reached USD 24.56 billion, rose 22.71% compared to the previous month. The highest increase was in animal or vegetable fats and oils commodity.

The EU contributed USD 1.68 billion, respectively, while Italy contributed 1.13%. By industry classification the exports of manufacturing products increased by 25.82% and by the province of origin West Java was the largest export producer, followed by East Kalimantan and East Java.

Import

April: A decrease of imports by 10.01% or worth USD 19.76 billion compared to the previous month with the most significant imports of machinery/mechanical appliances and parts thereof. The EU as a non-oil and gas trading partner country contributed USD 3.63 billion, respectively, with Italy at 0.72%. Indonesia's surplus was USD 7.56 billion.

May: A decrease of imports by 5.81% or worth USD 18.61 billion compared to the previous month with electrical machinery/equipments and parts thereof being the most significant decrease in imports. The EU as a non-oil and gas trading partner country contributed USD 4.52 billion, respectively, with Italy at 0.75%. Indonesia's surplus was USD 2.89 billion.

June: An increase of value imports by 12.87% or worth USD 21.00 billion compared to the previous month, with machinery/mechanical appliances and parts thereof parts being the most significant increase. The EU as a non-oil and gas trading partner country contributed USD 5.49 billion, respectively, with Italy at 0.74%. Indonesia's surplus of USD 5.09 billion.

In summary, the value of Indonesia's exports in Q2 reached USD 74.92 billion. Cumulatively, Indonesia's exports from the first half of 2022 reached USD 141.07 billion or increased 37.11% over the same period in 2021. By the province of origins, the three provinces that made the biggest contribution to national exports during the first half of 2022 were West Java with a value of USD 19.234.5 million (13.64%), followed by East Kalimantan at USD 16.062.7 million (11.39%), and East Java at USD 12,870.8 million (9.12%). Meanwhile, the value of Indonesia's imports in Q2 of 2022 only reached USD 59.37 billion. Compared with the same period last year, the total Indonesia imports for all broad economics categories in the first half of 2022 experienced increases, which consisted of USD 712.9 million (8.11%) of consumption goods, USD 21,010.9 million (30.41%) of intermediate goods, and USD 3,418.4 million (25.98%) of capital goods. Based on the country of origin, the main contributor to total non-oil and gas imports in the first half of 2022 was China USD 32,079.2 million (33.17%), followed by Japan USD 8,346.1 million (8.63%), and Thailand USD 5.830.7 million (6.03%).
