



The Central Bureau of Statistic (Badan Pusat Statistik/BPS) published Indonesian Agriculture Performance e-book with the title of "Indonesian Statistic 2023" that was released on February 2023. The summary examines the country's significant contribution to agriculture, forestry, livestock, and fishery industries. The data shows the total production of various agricultural and livestock products, along with their highest producer province as follows:

1. Food Crops

Grains and rice are the staple foods of Indonesia, making their production crucial to ensuring food security and maintaining affordable prices for consumers. As shown by the data, the production of grains and rice in Indonesia has shown a positive trend from 2021 to 2022. **Grains production increased by 2.3%**, from 54.415.294 tons in 2021 to 55.670.219 tons in 2022. Meanwhile, **rice production also increased by 2.3%**, from 31.356.017 tons in 2021 to 32.074.045 tons in 2022. This increment demonstrates the Indonesia's potential for continued growth in the agriculture sector, with the highest number of grains and rice producers from East Java province.

2. Horticulture

Indonesia continued to demonstrate its strength in the Horticulture industry. Horticulture production significantly contributes to the Indonesian economy, with various crops grown throughout the country. The data for horticulture production is separated into 4 (four) categories namely; vegetables, medical plants, ornamental plants, and fruits with detail as follows:

- The commodities of seasonal vegetables include Scallion, Shallots, Garlic, Spinach, String, Big Chili, Curly Chili, Cayenne Pepper, Oyster Mushrooms, Straw Mushrooms, Other Mushrooms, Long Beans, Water, Cauliflower, Potato, Cucumber, Cabbage, Chayote, Sweet Pepper, Chinese Cabbage/Mustard Green, Eggplant, Tomato, Carrot, with total production in 2022 is **14.061.374 tons**.
- The commodities of medicinal plants include Ginger, Lime, Java Cardamom, East Indian Galangal, Turmeric, Galangal, Zingiber Aromaticum, Aloe Vera, Phaleria Macrocarpa, Indian Mulberry, Black Turmeric, Chinese Keys, Java Turmeric, King of Bitter, Lemongrass with total production in 2022 are **934.652 tons**.
- The commodities of ornamental plants include Aglaonema, Potted Orchid, Cut Orchid, Flamingo Lily Flower, Bromelia, Bougainvillea, Cordyline, Dracaena, Gerbera (Herbras), Heliconia, Ixora, Chrysanthemum, Rose, Jasmine, Leather Leaf Fern, Palm, Phylodendron, Croton, Sansevieria, Tuberose, with total production in 2022 are **684.481.269 stalks**.
- The commodities of fruits include Avocado, Grape, Apple, Starfruit, Dragon Fruit, Duku/Langsat/Kokosan, Durian, Water Apple, Guava, Pomelo, Lemon, Orange/Tangerine, Longan, Mango, Mangosteen, Pineapple, Jackfruit, Papaya, Banana, Rambutan, Snake fruit, Sapodilla, Soursop, Breadfruit, with total production in 2022 is **28.205.880 tons**, and fruits include Melon, Watermelon, and Strawberry with total production in 2022 is **712.745 tons**.

3. Plantation Crops

The production data for plantation crops in 2022 shows that it has produced a **total of 53.602.1000 tons** of crops. The plantation crops sector consists of various commodities, including Rubber, Coconut, Crude Palm Oil, Coffee, Cocoa, Tea, Cashew Nut, Nutmeg, Pepper, and Clove. On the other hand, seasonal plantation crops including sugarcane and tobacco **produced 26.348.000 tons** in 2022.

4. Livestock

The total number of livestock in 2022 was recorded **at 39.193.685.000 livestock**, which **increased 7.73% from 2021** with recorded **36.382.953.000 livestock**. The data includes free-range chicken, laying hens, broilers, and ducks. Meanwhile, livestock such as Dairy Cattle, Beef Cattle, Buffalo, Horses, Goats, Sheep, and Pigs **increased from 618.033.000 livestock to 668.438.000 livestock**.

In conclusion, Indonesia's agriculture sector shows positive growth in various categories such as food crops, horticulture, plantation crops, and livestock. It is essential for the government to continue supporting and investing in the agriculture sector to ensure sustainable growth and food security in the country.
